TRANSFORMING ADVERSITY

Living the human existence means knowing the pain of what the world calls failure. Everyone feels the pain of failing at something sometimes. Even major biblical characters felt discouraged and despondent. For example, Moses said, "If this is the way you are going to treat me, put me to death at once...do not let me see my misery." And the prophet Elijah felt overwhelmed with failure: "But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a broom tree; and he asked that he might die, saying, "It is enough; now O Lord, take away my life." The issue is not failure but our response to it. Rather than give up or give in, we must fear less and have more faith to pursue our goals relentlessly while always trusting God for guidance.

"Hast thou not known? Has thou not heard, that the everlasting God, the Lord, the Creator of the ends of the earth, faileth not, neither is weary? There is no searching of his understanding. He giveth power to the faint; and to them that have no might he increaseth strength. Even the youths shall faint and be weary, and the young men shall utterly fall; But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary' and they shall walk, and not faint."
