PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As we slowly emerge from the blanket of winter, there have been a number of situations at our church, of which you should be aware.

1. As was reported in the March Newsletter, the computer and monitor in the church office had to be replaced. This was done to a cost of \$2,017.82 to Dell Computers plus an additional \$400 for technical support to upstart the new system. The new system is quick, clear and very efficient. We are grateful to practitioner, Wayne Gatewood for his generous gift of \$2,500.00 to the church in the form of a tithe, covering the aforementioned costs.

2. As of this writing, the complete boiler system that supplies heat to the church must be replaced. Sunday services shall be held in the library until the weather is warm enough for us to move back into the sanctuary. This is not an "easy fix event". The present boiler system is not longer made and Building and Facilities manager, Wayne Gatewood has sent out proposals and is getting estimates from at least 2 - 3 companies to seek the best price for purchase and installation of a new system. This is a very serious and expensive undertaking, but a very necessary one.

3. Save the date!! As a fundraiser to support the General Fund, the Board of Trustees is planning a musical gala to take place on Saturday evening, July 20 at 7:00 p.m. in our sanctuary. It will feature opera, musical theatre from our regular soloists and special invited jazz/blues performers. In order for the church to see the most profit, many Board members have volunteered to sponsor a number of items to help put a cap on the costs to the church. YOU may also help in this way. Please see any Board member. In addition to tickets, we will offer a journal in which you may purchase ads, full pages or a portion or be listed as a patron. Our official kick-off will be at the Annual Meeting in May. You may make purchases in person or, through the church office as a "will call" or at the door. Our official title is "A Midsummer Night's Music." This is an event that will be open to the public, therefore, we expect you to invite friends, neighbors and family members to attend. In addition, advertisement in the form of PSA's local newspapers and flyers will go out into the community. We have not had an event like this for some time and we are happy to have this event in our very own sanctuary, as we do have a beautiful baby grand piano. All detailed information will be available to you at the kick-off as well as in the May Newsletter.



4. It is critical that you be reminded of the church needs. We are fortunate that we were bequeathed a considerable sum of money by a member of our congregation just a few short years ago. Since that time, our church has been able to keep its doors open because of this sum. However, it will not last forever. Needless to say, our congregation has decreased over the years, but there are a number of people that we see some Sunday's and then we don't see them for a while. Divine Science is available to all, but as in any physical place of worship, we need you and your help. Please don't hesitate to let the Board know of suggestions or of your availability to give of yourself in the service of the church.
