There will be the **Annual Alumni Association meeting** following the Student Recognition Reception on June 24, 2018.

On May 6, 2018, the Alumni Association ended its year of speakers with Wayne Gatewood, who recently became a Divine Science practitioner. Wayne spoke about God as the expression of creation, and about our ability to think outside of the 5 senses, using our Intuition which lies within the Spiritual realm. He spoke about the fear we have of not wanting to let go of our condition even when we are not happy with where we are.

He shared a story about creatures that lived in a river and spent their entire lives clinging and holding on to the rocks with an enormous fear of letting go. One day however, one of the creatures did let go, he ultimately got tumbled and smashed, bounced around and bruised up, but eventually he was lifted free. When others downstream of the river, to whom he was a stranger, saw him they called him a miracle, a Messiah, but he told them "I am no more Messiah than you, the river delights to lift us free, if only we dare let go, our true work is this voyage out here in this life, this adventure," and the creature moved on leaving the others still clinging on to the rocks.

Next, Wayne spoke about the powerful song lyrics that describe the state of the world today, effectively revealing bible scripture that reflected these lyrics. He emphasized lyrics from the Temptation's song; "Ball of Confusion" which described the world we live in today. Wayne concluded his presentation by reminding us that confusion comes with the flesh, and nothing will change in the world until our consciousness changes.
