Thanks to your continued support, the bookstore showed a profit of \$279.37 for the first quarter of 2018. Below you will see the Profit and Loss Statement for the three month period, January through March 2018.

Here is a quick overview of the financial transactions that took place during the reporting period.

Our income for the three months totaled \$663.22 and is made up of book sales in the amount of \$637.72, reimbursement of postage and handling in the amount of \$5.50 and \$20.00 from the sale of CDs. Our expenses totaled \$383.85 of which \$333.85 was spent on the purchase of new books and \$50.00 in the miscellaneous category for a payment to Joshua Rich representing the sale of his CDs to members of the church following his December fund raising concert. It should be noted that individuals purchasing Joshua's CDs paid the bookstore in cash and a check was then written to Joshua.

# **ALUMNI ASSOCIATION**

On Sunday, April 15, 2018, Charmaine Hawkins, Michael Adeniji and Judy Coleman-Kla hosted a Spiritual Fairy Tale discussion. The Alumni Association selected "Jack and the Beanstalk" as the fairy tale to focus their discussion around. The task was to look closely at "Jack and the Beanstalk's" Spiritual construction. Fairy tales are allegorical, and are an excellent way of showing spiritual truths within a story format. These marvelous stories are filled with symbolism that resonates with the soul. They are more than simple works of good versus evil; they tap into something deeper, using symbols to trigger the subconscious mind, and deliver lessons. Some of the symbols selected from the "Jack and the Beanstalk" fairy tale were identified as: bean stalk, cow, widow, golden egg, and giant. These symbols were discussed, and interpreted in a variety of ways within the group, with all explanations, and translations contributing significantly to the message, meaning, and lesson it held for each of us.

Nevertheless, the meaning, message, and lesson of the fairy tale vary based on our level of consciousness, suggesting that we may learn in ways that are relevant to our individual stage of spiritual development. So be aware of the Spiritual message veiled within a Fairy Tale the next time you read one.
