suggestions that you may put forth that will contribute to the **continued revitalization** and betterment of our church.

Subtracting the expenses from the income our net income was \$277.13.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Alumni Association started its year of speakers with Jacqueline Scotland, a church practitioner. The purpose of our speakers throughout the year is to impart the wisdom we have learned.

Jacqueline selected Psalms 27 verse 4 to speak about: "One thing I ask from the Lord, this only do I seek; that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze on the beauty of the Lord and to seek him in his temple."

Jacqueline indicated that this particular verse resonated deep in her heart, even giving her goose bumps. She felt Spirit whisper that this was what she needed to work on. She said she had an experience similar to that which David had; the deep desire to be in the presence of being, and to bear witness to the truth. David was a man after God's heart, often referred to as the "Beloved," with pure focus, and intention. Jacqueline understood this kind of desire, and believed it's then that one experiences God's presence.

She informed us that as Truth seekers our desire should be to connect with Being, to abide in the transcending dimensions even while engaged in our daily activities. Jacqueline recognized that we may ask "how do I dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life with so much distraction?" She reminded us that Jesus showed us the way when, saying; "if we seek we shall find," and reminded us that when we are consecrated in truth we then invite the presence into consciousness. This is also the teaching and practice of Divine Science, done by way of prayer and meditation. Just as David, Jacqueline said we must direct our attention inward, be vigilant, and "gaze on the beauty of the Lord." This pattern has been laid out for us by Jesus. He was always lifted up, always in a place of higher

frequency or he would not have been able to accomplish the things he accomplished, telling us that greater things than he did we too will be able to accomplish.

This is a union we form when we enter the silence, it's a Spiritual marriage that Jacqueline called the "wedding dance," and described this personal heartfelt experience of God's love she was so privileged to have. The activity of love is a union of Spirit with the soul of man; this divine marriage is the experience of total oneness with all of its harmony and beauty. Through this union God expresses the fullness of his glory that we call miracles, but they are the norm. This is the temple of God, it's our dwelling place, and God continues to invite us in. This is the Light of God, which is the soul of man. When we look inwardly, when we are still and know who we truly are, we can go into the world and accomplish anything.
