Fall 2019 Divine Science Classes

Two of our fall classes start on Sunday, September 8, 2019, at 9:00 am:

Basic Principle of Divine Science Rev. Wayne Gatewood, Instructor

There is no prerequisite for this class. It is open to all.

The Basic Principle of Divine Science class is the foundation on which all the other classes are built. It is during this class that the student's faith in an ever-present Presence is awakened. Practical Instruction in the application of the teaching is given from the very beginning.

<u>Bible Mystery / Bible Meaning Old Testament</u> Ms. Sylvia Anderson, Instructor

Prerequisite: Basic Principle of Divine Science This class examines the Old Testament in terms of spiritual awareness. When interpreted through consciousness and personal experiences, the hidden meanings of biblical allegories, parables, and symbolic language are revealed. Students discover that the Bible is the story of their own unfoldment which awakens awareness of their divine nature.

Each class is 10 weeks long, tuition is \$65 and the auditing fee for those repeating the class is \$35. Each class is described in the special Education Issue 2018-2019. Sign-up sheets are on the table in the library.

Greetings one and all:

The end of Summer is fast approaching and the Fall activities and classes here at church are getting underway. The Summer was an exciting one at church, which is explained below:

1. The July music gala was extremely successful with many in attendance inquiring about another future similar event. Thanks to the members of the Board of Trustees and other members of the congregation, expenses were kept to a minimum. These individuals sponsored everything from the costs of singers and their accompanists, the reception, printing of tickets, flowers for the performers and decorating the Fellowship Hall. Although the concert took place on one of Washington's very warm evenings, we still had reputable attendance, and water was offered to those who wished it. For those individuals who were unable to come, it was a musical evening of opera, musical theater and jazz. Ms. Regina Bratton, Vice President of the Board was the narrator for all of the opera scenes so that the audience would know what the scenario was when the singing was in a foreign language. All of the opera and musical theater performers had been, or still are our own soloists and were accompanied by Mr. George Peachey, a former substitute organist. We were happy to in addition, Ms. Kathy Hankins and Ms. Tiya Miller as our jazz artists, accompanied by Ms. Janelle Gill.

We grossed slightly over \$4,000 from the evening and after expenses, netted a slight excess of \$2,000. This amount was turned over to the church General Fund. Special thanks to the Coates family for setting up the "goodies" and making Fellowship Hall a warm reception venue. Thanks to Rev, Donna Gatewood for spearheading the ticket table and to the church bookkeeper, Ms. Mayu White for doubling as a performer and also for working with Rev. Gatewood on keeping track of ticket sales and other related transactions.

Because of the amount of work that everyone employed to make this event successful, it is our fundraiser for the season and the Board agreed to omit the Chilly Dog Sunday this year. 2. We have Rev. Wayne Gatewood to thank for having the side porch and the steps leading to the downstairs hall painted prior to the concert. Since that time, the roof of the porch has also been replaced. These tasks were completed not only for their aesthetics, but were also done out of necessity.

3. At the 2014 Annual Meeting, it was voted that the church By-Laws be changed to accommodate a Board of 7 rather than 9 individuals. Since that time, our congregation has continued to shrink, with a limited Sunday attendance.. Some of our more active members have made their transitions, others have moved away, etc. The present Board has again discussed officially reducing the size of the Board from 7 to 5 individuals. This must be done by a congregational vote. While we had planned to have an open congregational meeting next month, the last discussion of this sort took place at the Annual Meeting, where we had more members in attendance. We will again do that this coming May. However, since voting for Board members is only through membership, all of this information will be on the May ballot. This allows for all of the information to be available to voting members. More on this subject will be in the January newsletter when openings for Board members will be announced.
