"AN EXAMPLE"

After Jesus washed his disciples' feet, he said, "For I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you." He didn't mean that they should necessarily wash the feet of others. He meant that all of their actions should be motivated in general by humility and service. His teaching was always centered on the Invisible Essence behind the visible form.

This motive is described in the verse in Philippians 2:5 KJV, "Let this mind be in you that was also in Christ Jesus." Other translations of this verse give different terms to describe the same thing. The Lamsa Translation reads, "Reason that within you which Jesus Christ also reasoned." The Phillips Translation reads, "Let Christ Jesus be your example as to what your attitude should be." The Message says it as, "Think of yourselves as Christ Jesus thought of himself."

Because our approach to life is based on our sense of identity, who we believe ourselves to be is of great importance. Jesus knew himself to be the child of God and he knew this was true for all others as well. He asked that others know it for themselves and live accordingly. He provided an example in both words and actions. We have been shown the way to realize God's Presence within us. His teaching, still relevant, is simply this, "Come. Follow me." Our Father, for the ability to return to your House, we give you thanks. Amen.
