“WHAT DO YOU HAVE IN YOUR HOUSE?”

It was said to be the war that would end all wars. When the armistice was signed in November of 1918 it was expected that that would be the last of major hostilities. But there were still more wars which followed and our headlines are replete with wars, stories of wars, new hostilities, threatened hostilities and the like. We are not at peace. Frankly, we have never been at peace. Much of the Bible is devoted to the recounting of wars, tribal conflicts, marauding empires, and during Jesus’s time Jerusalem was under Roman occupation. Rather than being a wartime leader like King David, Jesus went the other way. His sermon on the mount was hardly a wartime charge. Love your enemy. Share what you have. These are statements of a leader who seeks to bring peace through sharing and justice, and not through victory by using troops and wars.
